Discussion: Bob Meyer stated that he felt the By-Laws were not legally removed from the District's Laws due to there not being a 2/3 vote for ratification. The motion carried.

Grant Status Report: Gary Ovick presented.

Fish Stocking Committee Report: Bob Meyer presented. Bob stated that nobody knows exact survival rates, however, fishermen have had success catching stocked species. Bob stated that the DNR has approved our Program.

Navigation Committee Report: Ann Layton presented. The no wake zone on Church Pine had been extended to help long term.

Social Committee Report: David Zanick presented. The 4th of July parade was a success with 40 boats attending. The Social Dinner was considered being moved to the Annual Meeting evening.







Water Patrol Committee Report: Gary Ovick presented for Tom Bach. Our new Deputy is Matt Throngard. The Patrol Boat was paid off in 2013.

Water Quality Committee Report: David Zanick presented. Sampling of wells for phosphorous was done. Results are pending. The District will apply for a grant to study in-lake phosphorous. This will be deemed the "Healthy Lakes Implementation Plan" and will be zoned the following: Zone 1: Water. Fish Sticks. Zone 2: High Water mark up to 35 feet of shoreline. Zone 3: Above the 35 feet mark; Rain Gardens, French Drains, Rock Infiltration Pits, Runoff Control. Up to \$1,000. will be paid by the DNR or 75% of the approved project up to \$1,000. The EPA has placed Big Lake on a proposed "Impaired Lakes" list. If this proposed list is accepted, the District has a better chance of securing this Grant. The EPA has Federal (Impaired Waters Grant) funds for Grants if the "Impaired Lakes" status is obtained.

Web Site Committee Report: Jeri Diaz presented.

BREAK

2015 Budget Proposal: Gary Ovick presented. There has been no Levy increase in 3 years. (1) Grant ends, (2) Grants begin. A new boat will be purchased in 2015. This boat will be purchased outright as the funds are allocated. Steve Paulson motioned to approve the Budget, Tom Diaz seconded. Discussion: The question arose as to why a new boat? It made good financial sense – Trade in is good, money is in account. Motion carried unanimously. Budget Approved.

ELECTION: Gary Ovick presented the Board's nominees: Jerry Tack (up for re-election), and Beth Hartman, (replacing Steve Oswald). Also a write in candidate was available on the ballot. Jerry Tack received 28 votes, and Beth Hartman received 29 votes. Both were elected to a three year term.

- 1. Annette Viebrock has been the primary ramp inspector this year.
- 2. Obtained a \$6,000 grant from the DNR to fund up to \$8,000 in ramp inspector compensation.

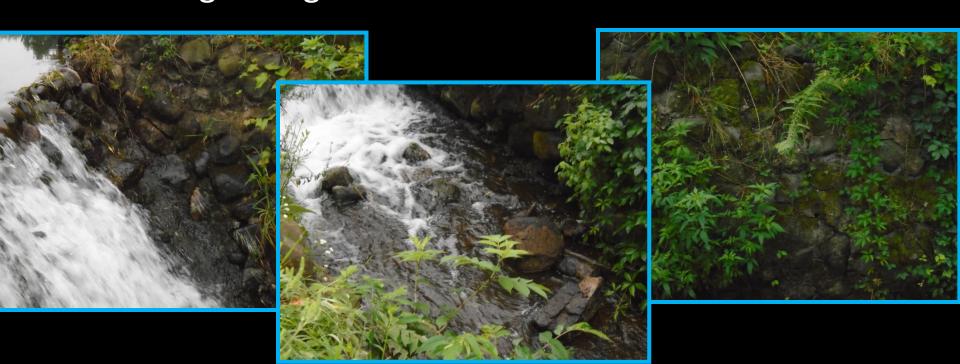
Addressed the issue of crumbling mortar between rocks lining the spillway in the Mill Pond Dam.

"August 1 YTD, from Jeff Hahn, Deputy Sheriff:"

1. 17.5 hours (vs 54 hrs. pro-rata 2014)

2. 14 contacts on the lake chain (vs 32 contacts pro-rata 2014)

3. 2 citations & many warnings (vs 4.5 citations pro-rata 2015)

4. Main issues:

- a. Operating without valid registration or required safety certificate
- b. Throughout the county there were COUNTLESS violations of the SNW where boats go SNW through a zone but once they pass the SNW buoy they ram the throttle
- 5. Problem = Lost full time person recently, thus the part time boat patrol person, has been filling in regular patrol shifts instead.

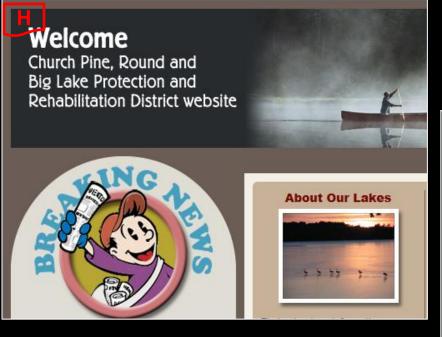

Polk County Sheriff's Department

in conjunction with local Lake Associations actively patrols this lake. Many of the most common complaints brought to the Polk County Sheriff's Department Water Patrol are briefly addressed below.

REGISTRATION: all boats (other than sailboats under 12' and manually propelled boats which do not have a motor) and PWC's must possess both a "Certificate of Number" (registration numbers) and Expiration Decals displayed on the front half of the bow in contrasting colors to the rest of the hull. This means <u>both</u> the annual sticker and the full registration number must be displayed. Boats kept on Wisconsin lakes for 60 consecutive days MUST be registered in Wisconsin. Fine for violations range from \$162.70 to \$200.50 and can be issued to operator <u>OR</u> owner.

UNDERAGE OPERATION: ANY operator born after January 1st, 1989 must possess (and be able to show) a Wisconsin approved Boater's Safety Certificate. Persons under the age of 12 may not operate a PWC. Persons between 10 years of age and 12 years of age may operate a boat only WITH direct parental supervision. Permitting underage operation or operating without Safety Certificate carries a fine of \$162.70.

PWC SPECIFIC RULES: PWC's may not be operated at greater than Slow No Wake (SNW) speed within 200' of shore or within 100' of another vessel, dock, raft, or a person water skiing. This means the slowest speed possible to maintain control. PWC's may not be operated between sunset and sumise. PWC's may tow a skier/tube rider if the PWC is designed to carry THREE persons and a "competent spotter" is riding and facing backward with the operator. More than one skier or tuber rider is allowed. All persons riding on or being pulled by a PWC must use approved Personal Floatation Device (PFD). PWC's must possess a fire extinguisher. Fines for these violations range from \$175.30 to \$200.50.

Water skier, dock, raft or buoyed restricted area (including SNW area). No persons are allowed to ride on boat decks or gunwales (side of the boat, seat backs, sun decks or seats on raised platforms). All boats operated between sunset and sunrise must use required lighting. Boats may not exceed restrictions of Capacity Plates, must possess sufficient PFD's for all passengers and must possess a fire extinguisher in a "readily accessible location" if the boat has any closed construction (compartment of any kind). The boat's battery must have terminals covered and be held in place to prevent the battery frommoving. Boats must have a competent spotter in the boat when towing skiers (mirrors do not fit Wisconsin's requirement). Towing skiers between sunset and sunrise is prohibited. Fines range from \$162.50 to \$200.50.

RECKLESS OPERATION/INTOXICATED BOATING: Creating a hazardous or dangerous wake, operating in a "reckless manner" or using "unreasonable or imprudent speed" are all illegal. Operating under the influence of an intoxicant or with a detectable amount of a restricted controlled substance can result in fines, an arrest or both. Fines for these violations range from \$162.50 to \$452.50 and can also result in an arrest and criminal charges.
