The 2nd quarterly meeting of the Church Pine, Round, and Big Lake Prot. and Rehab. District board members was called to order by President Dick Berquist, at Dick's New Richmond Insurance office at 7:00 PM, May 17, 1990. Attending were Dick Berquist, Fred Homan, Don Jahnke, Reuben Johnson, Kathy Videen, Dale Selzer, and Keith Lindstrom.

Dick B. received a letter from Pearl Larson, requesting that the dam be repaired. Discussion followed; we cannot repair it at this time because the water level is too high. Don J. and Dale S. will investigate, and watch for lower water levels when repairs can be made.

We received 2 bids for weed cutting. MM Fred, 2nd Dick to accept Midwest Aqua Care's bid. Motion passed.

Secchi disc readings are Church Pine 25' +, Big Lake 21', Round 13'.

Discussion of weed cutting involved the cost of cutting twice a year, and the costs of purchasing our own machinery and possibly leasing it out, to recoup some of our expense. Don J. and Dale S. will bring information and recommendations to the annual meeting. Budgeting increases will be necessary, and purchase would be at least 2 years away.

Fred reported that Jeff Timmons and a DNR representative will be walking the Pelican Creek area, in their investigation of the Wanderos well problems. Our Limtech study showed a direct correlation ^{between} our water quality and pollution from the creek. There are funds available from boating revenues at the state, that we as a lake district can apply for. Fred will be following up.

As of 5/15/90 we have \$10, 351.43 in the treasury.

We dicussed the possibility of dredging at both channels. Dale will contact Larry Damon about getting permits; then we can check into the costs involved. We don't HAVE to use the permits.

Keith Lindstrom informed us that he expected a shortage of Water Patrol personnel this year. Sheriff Benware has required that anyone planning to work as water patrol was required to take a boating safety instructor course; several of last years patrol declined taking the training. Non-certified personnel can ride with in the boat, as long as they don't attempt to make any arrests. Keith will check with the Sheriff to see if we can have the boat on the lake ourselves as just a deterrent. Application for the marker buoys went in @ 5/5/90. MM Fred, 2nd Don, that we pay certified police officers working as water patrol, the normal pay rate as PT police officers of \$9.53/hr.. Fred will file 1099's. Once we have permission for non-certified personnel, we will set the rate of pay. A property owner had requested that the sheriff's dept. personnel detour out of their way to check on activity at the Church Pine landing; this is not possible.

MM Fred, 2nd Don that meeting be adjourned; motion passed.

The first quarterly meeting of 1990 of the Big, Churchpine, and Round Lake Protection and Rehabilitation District was held 1-6-90 12:30 PM at Dick Berquist's office in New Richmond. Attending were Don Jahnke, Fred Homan, Dick Berquist, Kathy Videen, and Reuben Johnson.

Fred reported the treasury had \$3633 in checking.

We need to slow the flow of the creek into Big Lake. At one time there was high water caused by a plugged culvert. Perhaps this could be our solution. Fred and Don will contact the property owner whose land surrounds the culvert under the RR tracks. Fred will contact Jeff Timmons to get aerial photos.

The dam needs repair again.

The property easement dispute is now in the hands of Garfield town board members.

Osceola township property owners within 1000' of Big Lake should be placed within our lake district. Dick will check into the wording of the original lake district agreement.

Don Jahnke will oversee obtaining weed cutting bids.

Dick was hoping to have weed cutting information from Dale S.. Dick had a flyer from one company, and knew that Johnson's outfit was for sale - it would need \$3000 to get it into operating condition and would cost @\$50,000 to buy. We will acquire information for the annual meeting.

Corrected length of members' terms are Dale S. - 3 year term to 1992, and Don J. - 1 year term to 1990.

The same people will be working boat patrol this summer; the boat is in storage.

DNR finally planted 6000 7-10" walleye fingerlings.

Don wants 4 buoys at each channel marking SLOW, NO WAKE zones.

WALD meeting in Stevens Point is April 7-8.

Our next meeting will be in April.

Fred motioned we adjourn; Don 2nded, and the meeting was adjourned.
