Meg Radde (with son's help on computer), from Barr Engineering, gave a lengthy and informative report of the weed study. The results state:

All treatments had an effect with decreased plant mass.

The effects were not uniform.

The recommendation is treatment with lime slurry to reduce stem density.

Funding thru the WDNR for a Lake Planning Grant should be applied for.

Applications have a May deadline and results known in 6 months. Suggests applying 5/02.

The complete written study results will be available by the Sept. '01 annual meeting.

County Road K- a 5 phase project to relocate is being looked at.

\$10,000. /project

Concern re. increased truck traffic on K.

Safety concerns when accessing the boat landing.

Alternative route to the north by Nye across to Amery-concerns being:

- 1. The WS Central railroad was sold to Canadian Pacific
