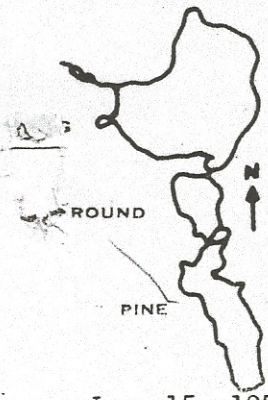

# Big - Round - Pine Lakes Association

Dear Members:

The annual meeting of the Big-Round-Pine Lakes Association was held on June 15, 1974 at the Erveen Johnson cabin, Big Lake. The minutes of the 1973 meeting were read and approved. The treasurer's report was also read and accepted.

Frank Winickie reported that the signs limiting speeds on the lake channels and the private roads have been completed. John Traun volunteered to help install the signs in the channels between the lakes and Frank installed the signs on the private roads. We hope this will reduce the speeds of both the boats and the cars.

Mr. Sheldon Weiss reported on the shocking of the lakes for a fish count. He reported that Big Lake is being used as a test lake and a report of the results will be forthcoming this fall.

Swimmer's itch was brought up as an annoying problem on the North side of Big Lake. John Traun suggested that the Lakes Association pay for the expense of spraying that area to rid the lake of the Chiggers. Motion was made and carried that the Association take care of the problem. Frank Winiecki appointed Erveen Johnson to check with Department of Natural Resources and obtain the necessary permit and equipment. ( Chemicals and equipment have been bought and the spraying will be done next summer.)
