

GENERAL MEETINGS 1983
Annual Meeting July 30, 1983

The annual meeting of the Church Pine Round and Big Lake Protection and Rehabilitation District was held July 30, 1983 at West Immanuel Church at 1:30 P.M.

The meeting was called to order by our chairman, Dick Larson. Dick introduced the board members and guest speakers. The minutes of the last annual meeting and a summary of the four board meetings were read and approved. The treasurer's report was read and approved. Expenses for the year were \$366.99. Present balance is \$5,836.12.

Eldon Kern, Fish management, gave a report on fish planting in our lakes. Most of the fish planted this year were eaten by the green sunfish due to the gate missing in the culvert. Eldon will take care of installing and removing the gate this coming year.

Rich Cornelius was introduced and gave us a report on the planting of fish in our lakes. He reported northern rather than Walleyes and bass, would be the best fish to plant because they are more compatible to our three lakes. Pine Lake, being the deepest of the three lakes, could have bass

planted in it. He also reported that the lake would be shocked in September to combat the fish.

Dick Larson gave a report on the accomplishments throughout the year. He reported that when money is available from the Department of Natural Resources through Step 1, Matiffy Engineers will send someone to assess the lakes for pollution, drainage, run off and sewer systems. Dick presented a chart which showed where our tax dollars are spent in the township. He reported the County is trying to get the 911 emergency number made available to property owners on the lake. The County has marked all the roads with street names and numbers making it easier for someone to locate your home. Dick reported on the results of the survey that was sent to all lake property owners.

Under old business, dredging between the lakes was brought up. The importance of boating from lake to lake was discussed. To dredge between Pine Lake and Round Lake a permit from the Department of Natural Resources would be required. There also was discussion on what should be done.

with the dirt that would be removed. This dirt should not be placed on private property. A motion was made by Frank Winicki, seconded by Beverly Simmiger, to dredge the area between Round Lake and Pine Lake. A vote was taken and the results was 14 yes, 25 no motion not carried.

New Business. A discussion took place on what could be done to get rid of weeds, algae and jugs. A suggestion was made to hire a weed cutting firm and have the weeds cut for several years. A motion was made by John Scanlon, seconded by Murray Cassidy, to raise our mill rate .05 or $\frac{1}{2}$ cent and use the extra money to hire someone to cut weeds. A vote was taken and the result was 45 yes - 0 no motion carried. Dick Larson will contact different weed cutting firms for prices.

Nominations were open. A motion was made by Richard Hodel seconded by Lionel Forrest to have Dick O'Brien as Treasurer. A motion was made by Tom LeRouf seconded by Edward C. Miller, to close the nominations. A vote was taken and the results was 45 yes - 0 no. Motion carried. Dick will remain as Treasurer for one more year.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting - coffee and lemonade was served by Carlene Jaxon and Bea Hing.
